Statement of [REDACTED]

On a Saturday evening, approximately two months ago, I visited overnight at the home of Roy Case for the purpose of helping him deliver his newspapers on Sunday morning.

Roy picked me up at my house at approximately 6:00 p.m. and we went over to his house. Upon arrival at the Case home, Roy gave me some magazines to look at. The magazines varied from "pin-up" to "hard-core" pornography showing men and women engaged in sexual intercourse.

Later that evening, we went to a drive-in movie and a Burger Chef, returning to Roy Case's house at approximately 11:00 p.m. I read some more of the magazines given me by Roy and then we went to bed at about 11:30 p.m.

Roy had a double bed and during the hour it took me to go to sleep, Roy made three or four homosexual advances towards me.

Other boys have told of similar experiences with Roy Case --
[REDACTED] at Roy's house, [REDACTED] at the beach, and [REDACTED]
whom you know about.

This statement prepared for me by Mr. Arthur J. Desrosiers, Jr. of the Boy Scouts of America is true in all respects.

Statement of [REDACTED]

On the evening of March 13, 1972, my son [REDACTED] as in the Scoutmaster's V.W. camper en route to McDonalds after a meeting of Troop 103. D.S.


The Scoutmaster, Roy Case, was driving and there were several other boys in the camper. Casual remarks made by Mr. Case were understood by [REDACTED] to mean that the boys in the back of the camper were "queers" or homosexuals. [REDACTED] snapped back that the only one in that category was the driver, where upon Mr. Case got angry, stopped the V.W. and told [REDACTED] to get out and walk.

Mr. Case stated to me that when he left, he only drove a short distance down the road and then returned to pick up [REDACTED]. My son did not wait for Mr. Case to return, but went directly to a friend's house and called me to come and get him, which I did.

When we got home, I questioned [REDACTED] about his statement, whereupon he told me that because of a cold on a weekend camping trip, he was sleeping in the camper with the Scoutmaster. During the night, Mr. Case had made homosexual advances towards him and out of fear, [REDACTED] left the camper and slept on the ground with the other Scouts. [REDACTED] further stated that [REDACTED] had also had homosexual advances made toward him by Mr. Case.
